In a decreasing lamb market, premiums offered for well finished trade and export lambs are often significantly higher than the market average. Mr Savli will discuss the value of mineral, vitamin and trace element supplementation in efficiently and economically finishing lambs on spring pasture. He will also discuss the role of grain supplementation on green feed and how to safely feed grain for maximum results.

NSW is currently transitioning to mandatory individual electronic identification for sheep and goats. Brooke will provide an update on the latest information on the introduction and phase in procedure for sheep and farmed goats. There will also be information on funding opportunities that have become available to aid producers during this transition.

Col will discuss key findings from local GRDC and NSW DPI cropping research projects. Key factors to improve canola establishment (openers, press wheel pressure, depth, soil moisture and nutrition) will be covered. The benefits of vigour testing and the steps to grow high vigour seed will be revealed. Col will also cover the use of companion crops to reduce fertiliser inputs and increase profitability in the central west.
